"It's Still All About Jesus"

Next Week in Chapel

We welcome Rev. Nick Koschmann, Pastor at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in Forest Grove as our chapel leader on Wednesday, November 1. Pastor Koschmann will talk with us about *It's still all about "The Faithful Witness"*. Our text for the week is from Revelations 1:5.

In today's Bible reading, Jesus is called the Faithful Witness.

Imagine that we are on trial before God as our judge. Different witnesses could come forward and truthfully testify against us. The accusations could come from the 10 Commandments. We have used God's name in vain; we have not worshipped God as we should; we have not obeyed our parents and teachers; we have hurt others with our words; we have coveted things that are not ours. The witnesses against us emphasize that we are guilty.

Jesus comes into the trial setting and He testifies that He has taken all of our guilt upon Himself. Any punishment that we have deserved, He has taken with Him and experienced our punishment on the cross. Jesus is the Faithful Witness that declares that since our sins have been paid for, we are declared not guilty. We are set free from any punishment we deserved.

Jesus is the only Witness that can testify for us. He is the only Witness who has the power to free us. Freed by Jesus, we are blessed to be His witnesses to the world. This past Sunday, the church celebrated All Saints Sunday. Our worship celebrated those who by faith witnessed Jesus' death and resurrection and who had Jesus as their Witness. Thankful for His freeing message, they gave witness to Jesus with their words and lives. Remembering our Reformation celebration, we give thanks for those who were witnesses for Jesus in the early history of our church.
